What a Main Idea Is and How to Find It - ThoughtCo

The main idea is a general "umbrella" idea; all the specific supporting material of the passage fits under it. Three strategies that will help you find the main idea are to 1) look for general versus specific ideas; 2) use the topic (the general subject of a section) to lead you to the main idea; 3) use key words—verbal clues that lead you to a main idea.

Characteristics of a Main Idea A main idea is always a complete sentence that states an important point about the topic. That's why you can often find the topic in the main idea sentence. Main ideas are never questions; they're always statements.
