### Different Sources of Power that Affect the Teacher-Student ...

The absence of classroom interaction results in teacher losing power. Therefore, if the interaction is not carried out in the classroom, then the teacher cannot lead the students, and power in the classroom cannot be not exercised. Mugford (2011) rephrases that students' different characteristics can be altered through classroom interaction.

### Politeness and Power Relation in EFL Classroom ...

Contrary to the common assumption that the teacher is the source of classroom power, it sees that power as arising from the interaction between students and teachers. If power is owned by the teacher, she is completely responsible for events in the classroom, whether or not she chooses to share her power/control/authority with the students.

### **Classroom Interaction Patterns, Teacher and Student ...**

For example, our coding of teacher control included teachers' management and power, tolerance for noise in their classroom, and comfort allowing students to work in groups. While these behaviors may overlap with teaching/ parenting style practices (e.g., rule setting; Wentzel 2002 ), our observation was not conceptually based on these dimensions.
