The word "shamanism" derives from the Manchu-Tungus (Northern Asia) word šaman, meaning one who knows. Shamanism has been termed "humanity's oldest and universal expression of religiosity," and its cross-cultural presence among hunter/gatherer societies suggest a connection to the evolution of the brain.

The word "shaman" originated in the Evenki language of Siberia, where its exact meaning is unclear. From this murky beginning, anthropologists have spread the term to describe spiritual practitioners of many cultures, and the term "shamanism" has been adopted by many native Americans and other groups.

Shamanism also existed among nearly all documented hunter-gatherers, likely characterized the religious lives of many ancestral humans, and is often proposed by anthropologists to be the "first profession," representing the first institutionalized division of labor beyond age and sex.

The cultural evolution of shamanism

Also Taoism has some of its origins from Chinese shamanism: it developed around the pursuit of long life (shou 壽 / 𠄎), or the status of a xian (仙, "mountain man", "holy man").
